
Fay's Forum – Pandemic Hits Women Hard

October is Domestic Violence Awareness Month, and the pandemic has had wide-ranging effects on violent incidents. Abusers and their family have been spending more time together which can heighten tensions and anger. Resources for aid have also been affected, thereby limiting the avenues for obtaining help. Women who do get out of abusive relationships are now having trouble getting registered to vote and getting their ballots because they don't want their current address to be made public.

The pandemic has upended work, school and home life for everyone, but women continue to shoulder the heaviest burden. Women have disproportionately lost their jobs (especially women of color). Many women feel forced to leave the workforce due to home schooling, child care and other issues. It is predicted that this will be a long-lasting trend, and may undermine women's progress in the workplace for years to come.
